# Parks Day July 16, 2005

The Fortress of Louisbourg helped celebrate Parks Day in conjunction with Mira River Provincial Park. Staff have taken part in this event for the past three years but this year was even better than the excellent celebrations that we had in the past.

This years events included our contribution of soldiers, militia, aboriginal scout, drummer and fifer as well as helicopter water bombing display from the Provincial Dept of Natural Resources, tepees and drummers/dancers from local aboriginal communities, and a contingent from the Canadian Armed Forces. The highlight of this years celebrations was planting a maple tree as a memorial to Canadian veterans (in honour of the Year of the Veteran). This dedication included an honour guard consisting of Veterans, Legion representatives, Canadian Forces personnel, and the Fortresses Military interpreters and representatives from the Mi'kmaw community.

The celebrations lasted from mid morning until late afternoon with 18<sup>th</sup> century drum and musket demonstrations, 18<sup>th</sup> century field camp style living, and aboriginal displays being provided by the Fortress staff as well as all the activities provided by the many other participating groups. The Provincial Park had the day full of entertainment for both young and old, from demonstrations, interpretive talks, ghosts stories by campfire, to treasure hunts,

games and a family barbeque, the highlight of which was the planting the maple tree in honor of the Veterans.

He explained extinguisher information such as size, use, inspections, maintenance and replacement. He then allowed the staff to practice some hands on fire extinguishing using different size extinguishers. Chief Roberts explained the "PASS" theory of using extinguishers which means Pull the pin, Aim the nozzle, Squeeze the handle and Sweep the fire!! When done properly, the fire (which he kept setting!) would be out in less than two seconds. Connie won the prize for getting the fire out the quickest. The newly trained team was rewarded

for their efforts when Chief Roberts took all for a ride around the village of Baddeck in the new fire rescue vehicle. An informative, educational and fun morning!
