It is with regret and sadness that we note the passing of fellow Parks Canada employee and long time Louisbourg resident Larry Rudderham on December 19 / 2005 at the Cape Breton Regional Hospital, after a courageous battle with cancer. He was 68. Left to mourn are his four children, a brother, three sisters and many relatives, special friends, and former co-workers. Larry was pre-deceased by his wife Kathy (Hiltz) in 2003.

At the age of 19 he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force where he served for three years. Upon returning to Louisbourg in 1959 he was married and shortly thereafter joined the Parks Canada labour force on the reconstruction of the Fortress of Louisbourg National Historic Site.

Around 1974 Larry transferred to Fundy National Park as Maintenance Supervisor. At the first opportunity though he returned to his beloved Cape Breton Island taking up the position of Maintenance Supervisor at Cape Breton Highlands National Park in 1977 where he worked until his retirement in 1991. After retirement Larry maintained his close association with Parks Canada by working as a Commissionaire at Broad Cove Campground in Cape Breton Highlands National Park for three seasons. His final posting was again at the Fortress of Louisbourg NHS where he served faithfully in the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires from 1995 until his retirement from the Corps in 2004.
