Louisbourg Lighthouse Day

On Saturday August 22, the Louisbourg Lighthouse Society and the Coastal Connections Trail Association hosted Lighthouse Day marking the 275th anniversary of the first lighthouse going into operation. Parks Canada co-operated with these societies to provide an interesting round of activities. The societies also received support from the CBRM Recreation Association and the Louisbourg Fire Department.

Senator Mike MacDonald, MLA Alfie MacLeod and Councillor Brian Lahey attended and gave greetings. Jean Bagnell for the Lighthouse Society and Mike Hunter for the Trail Association spoke to their organizations' goals and future plans.

Activities included a barbeque and live music, talks on the history of the lighthouse and navigation in the 18th and 20th centuries, cannon firings, drumming demonstrations, a siege tour of Lighthouse Point and a geocaching demonstration.

There were also reproductions of the plans of the first lighthouse, the original lead plaque from that lighthouse and Marmon Smith's models of the lighthouses on boats as well. Parking and traffic regulation were well in hand with excellent co-operation from CBRM Police.

Improvements had also been made to the physical presentation of the site. The ruins of the first, and particularly the second lighthouse, were worked on and looked the best they have for years. The Historic Sites and Monuments Boards plaques on the current lighthouse were also refurbished. Grass and alder cutting were also done and much appreciated.

Thanks to all Parks Staff who provided support, especially to Heritage Presentation and Cultural Resources for the presentations, demonstrations, HSMBC plaques and traffic control and to Asset Management for improved preservation and presentation of the lighthouse ruins and general appearance of roads and facilities.

Information gathering for the development of a database of people interested in the fortress is in progress. We will be disseminating information on FLA, town and fortress activities (as required) through a regular newsletter.

The FLA has opened a satellite office in the Town Hall.

These programs will continue to run and Sandra is investigating some new initiatives which may include the developing a small group package that will be available for purchase on the new FLA website, a wedding package will be developed and we will attend an Atlantic Canada bridal exposition.

It will be held in trust and opened by members of the Club in 2059 and replaced with a new time capsule to be held in trust for the next fifty years. It is of note that among those who did the presenting was an 18 year old who hopefully will be here for the opening the capsule in fifty years and will call us from time to time for updates between now and then on its safekeeping. Another of the time capsules will be held in trust at the Rockcliffe Flying Club and another will be held in trust at the Canada Aviation Museum.

Rokkaku Kite-making Workshop

In celebration of Canada's centennial of flight, this once in 100 years 2 day kite-making workshop is being offered to a limited number of participants on a first come, first served basis on Thursday, September 17th & Friday, September 18th.

AGBNHSC is delighted to offer this unique Silver Dart Centennial experience in collaboration with the Silver Dart Centennial Association. Kite-maker Bill Wilson and fabric artist Anne Morrell will guide this workshop providing the inspiration and expertise required for each participant to design and construct a Rokkaku kite. Rokkaku kites originated in Japan. The size of the Rokkaku is 6ft tall by 5ft wide. about 24 sq. ft. when you subtract the triangles at the top. A very capable kite, that can fly in as gentle as 5 km/h up to 30 km/h (but gloves are recommended).

Harvest Home - Planning is underway for our annual Harvest Home celebration which this year will have a very special Silver Dart Centennial feature in that it will take place at Beinn Bhreagh. Approximately 500 visitors will have the opportunity for this experience on Saturday, September 19th on a first come, first served basis. This year we will host the same line up of activities twice – 250 can participate in the morning and 250 can participate in the afternoon. Activities will include old style games like sack race, tug of war and potato race, facepainting, Bubbles the Clown, RAZZMATAZZ, kite flying and more.

Marconi NHSC - A PowerPoint presentation on Guglielmo Marconi's life and work focussing on his1902 wireless transmission was prepared and delivered by Marconi staff at Mira Provincial Park Marconi as part of the Department of Natural Resources education program to educate visitors as well as community members on local history.

Canso Islands NHSC - The Site participated in the parade during the annual Canso Regatta celebrations with BOOMER on board the Parks Canada truck. The Site's wharf was the starting point for the annual boat and swim races.
